

Understanding your Academic Advisement Report

Please note: *The Advisement Report is a tool to audit degree requirements. Curriculum requirements are outlined in the School of Graduate Studies Calendar, in any given year, and are subject to change.*

It is the responsibility of the student, in consultation with their Program, to ensure that all requirements have been satisfied.

The Graduate Academic Advisement Report is broken down into the following sections:

- School of Graduate Studies Required Courses
- Career Specific Requirements for your academic plan (if applicable)
- Program Specific Requirements – consisting of courses and milestones (a milestone is a non-course academic requirement, such as a project or a thesis)
- Additional Elective Courses (Non-Prescribed)
- Graduate Studies Exclusions


School of Graduate Studies Required Courses

Each student is required to complete two required courses: SGS 101 and 201 once during their career as a graduate student. Once completed, they will show as completed and the requirement will be satisfied.

Below is an example of a satisfied requirement:

Career Specific Requirements for your plan

For students who transition from Masters to PhD, there are requirements that may be required to be completed only once during their career.

For example, students in the Physics and Astronomy department are required to take two specified courses at some point in their career. This can be either as a Masters student or a PhD. Any requirements that are specific to the career will be detailed in this section.

▼ **Physics PhD Required Courses**

Satisfied: The minimum course requirement for the Ph.D. is one full graduate course at the 700-level beyond the M.Sc., for a minimum total of 3 full graduate courses in the combined M.Sc. and Ph.D. degrees. The Department expects that most candidates will be required by their supervisory committee to complete more than the minimum number of courses. Two of the four following half courses must be completed in either the M.Sc. or Ph.D.:

- PHYSICS 739 / Advanced Quantum Mechanics I
- PHYSICS 740 / Advanced Quantum Mechanics II
- PHYSICS 746 / Advanced Classical Electrodynamics
- PHYSICS 750 / Statistical Mechanics


